Regional Destination Development: Fundy Connects Summit



On November 1st-3rd, community members and leaders, local business owners and operators, not-for-profit organizations, and representatives from all levels of government gathered from across the country and convened at the Poley Mountain Resort to share ideas, experiences, and plot a course forward for the Upper Bay of Fundy Rural Region. Based on what we learned together at the Summit, the Upper Bay of Fundy Rural Destination Development Project will focus on the following tasks over the next 6 months:

- Determine the organizational structure, governance, and funding model for a new stakeholder-led destination management organization for the Upper Bay of Fundy region that reflects the UNWTO principles and maintains the health and prosperity of local community economies at its core.
- Collaborate to host professional development workshops for operators and community organizations who want to build and develop businesses that incorporate regenerative principles and practices into their operations.





- Convene follow-up facilitated sessions to build off the work we began
 at the Summit related to trails development, housing, labour, and
 transportation. As well as connect stakeholders working on critical
 infrastructure items impacting our region.
- Continue to develop relationships and explore potential for formal partnerships with the Upper Bay of Fundy's five levels of government – municipal, regional service commissions, Indigenous, provincial, and federal.
- Continue to engage throughout communities in the region to welcome new people, groups, and organizations into the conversation.

Regional Destination Development: Fundy Connects Summit

Christmas Bird Count



The **Christmas Bird Count** is North America's longest running Citizen Science project, dating back to 1900! Volunteers gather on a day between December 14th and January 5th and, guided by a compiler, tally the number of birds and species they spot while following a prescribed route.


Fundy National Park is holding their count on Friday, December 16th with some info sessions December 3rd and 10th.

The Moncton Dog Runners and Maritime Association of Harness Dog Sports (MAHDS) is gearing up for the 2023 Dog Days of Winter at Fundy National Park over the Family Day Weekend, February 18th - 20th.

Dog Harness Sports are an exciting exercise in endurance and teamwork where a human and at least one canine companion work together to traverse a course. The weekend will feature races - including Canitrail, Skijoring, Kicksledding, and Bikejoring - as well as intro sessions, an evening snowshoe hike open to all, and more!
